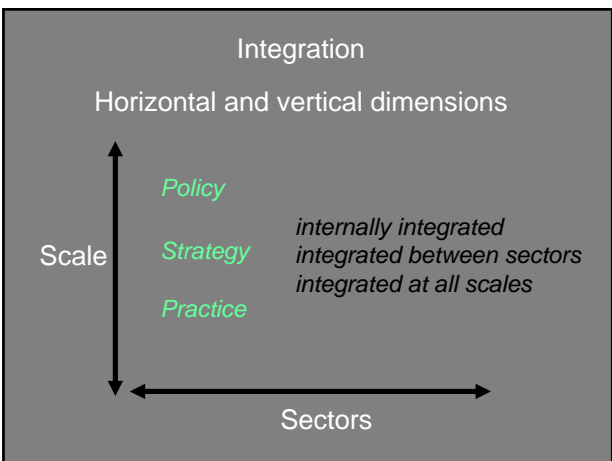
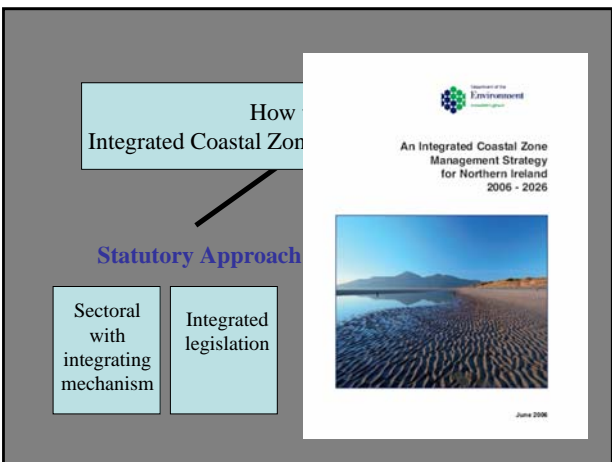
- ### 8 Key Principles for ICZM

 8. Use of combination of instruments

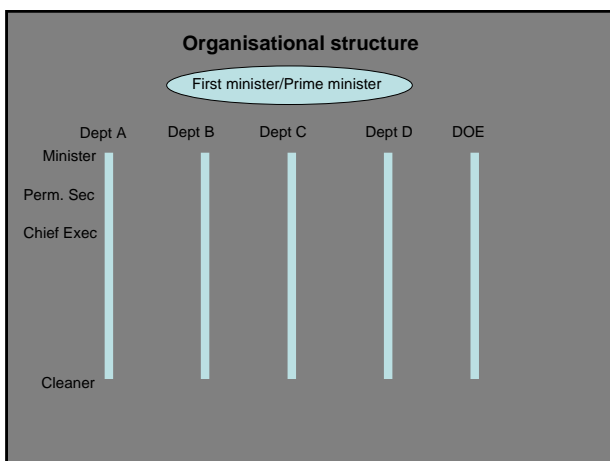
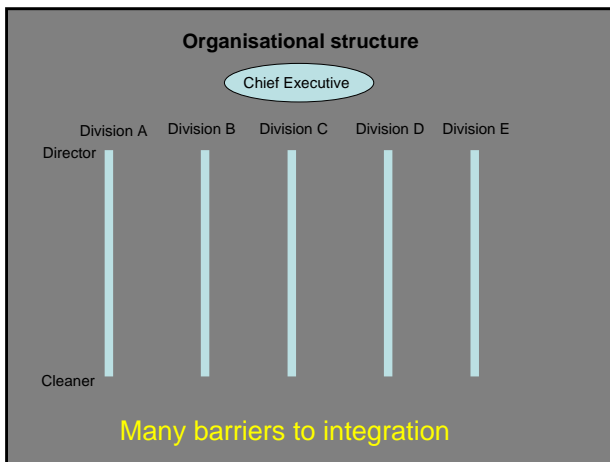
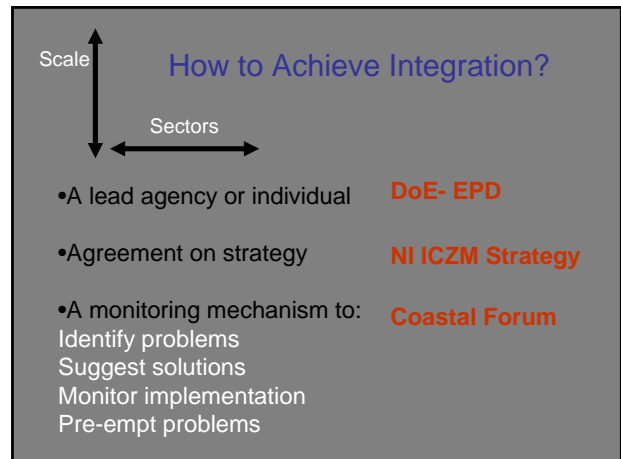
ICZM

Coastal Fora: a commentary

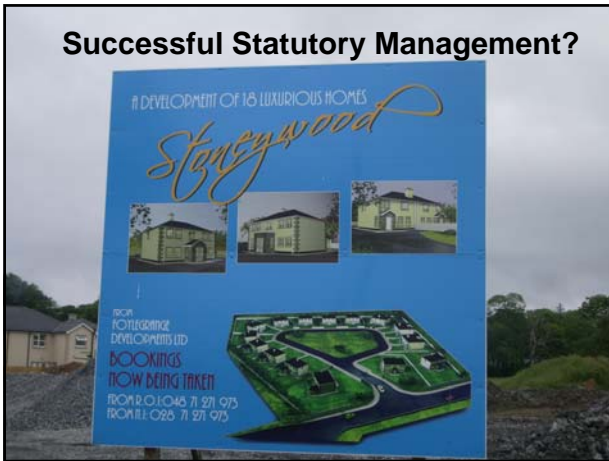
The vacuum in ICZM (no government leadership) led to a proliferation of voluntary coastal partnerships

Often have no connection to the statutory system of governance

Planning and management is the responsibility of statutory organisations (with power, resources and responsibility)

The Role of Coastal Fora is to support these organisations- not to replace them

A Coastal Forum is just one of several potential mechanisms

Latest news about the Plan: Judicial Review (JR) to Draft Northern Area Plan Strategic Environmental Assessment (SEA)

15th October 2007

Seaport Investments applied for a Judicial Review into the Draft Plan's SEA. Leave was granted for the DNAP JR in January 2006, and this was heard before Mr Justice Weatherup from 28th November to 1st December 2006.
